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Introduction

The *Unity Project* is divided into two segments in each session. We do suggest groups meeting monthly complete both segments each time you meet. The study can be utilized one segment at a time for those that meet more frequently.

This study includes video lectures from our pastoral staff to be followed by discussion utilizing the questions provided in this guide. Feel free to add your own questions as well.

Our goal is to provide a solid biblical foundation for the spiritual growth and maturing of the individual believer. Spiritual maturity helps forge the path to unity in the body of Christ. We trust that you will find this study both interesting and beneficial.

Session One:

Introduction to the Unity Project

Welcome to the Unity project! The first half of this study is based upon Chapters 1-3 of Ephesians. These chapters help establish church doctrine. The second half of this study covers chapters 4 – 6. These latter three chapters explain the application of the doctrine.

Video one: The Unity Project Intro **Pastor Kathy**

In this video we will discuss:

- Paul's first recorded visit to Ephesus appears in Acts 18:19. During Paul's second missionary journey Paul left co-workers Aquila and Priscilla behind in Ephesus while he continued his travel to Caesarea.
- Paul returned to Ephesus on his 3rd missionary journey and stayed almost 3 years. He left there to go to Macedonia, on his return voyage to Jerusalem he met with church leaders nearby one last time.
- AD 61 he was in a Roman prison and wrote a letter to the Ephesians. (the prison epistles)

Paul often used analogies to explain spiritual principles. He referred to the building of the church as one built upon a foundation of the teachings of the apostles and prophets. These teachings establish the doctrine upon which we are to build. Healthy spiritual growth is dependent upon having a secure foundation.

- Discuss building your faith upon tradition rather than building upon fresh spiritual revelation. How can that hinder your walk?

- What are some biblical examples of conflicts created when traditional beliefs differed from the biblical revelation taught by Jesus and his followers?
- How can understanding the difference between biblical traditions and sound doctrine help us to safely remain flexible to fresh revelation?

Video two: The Background Story by Pastor Rob

If we were living in Ephesus during Paul's day, what would we see, hear, feel, and experience there?

- Geographically
- Culturally
- Economically
- Spiritually
- Who is Diana/Artemis? What is her significance in the events that transpired in Ephesus?
- Finally, what made Ephesus a significant location for the spread of the gospel to other locations?

Session Two:

The Significance of Mentors

Session two of our study will focus on the relational background of people who influenced the move of God in Ephesus. In addition to Paul, we also have Aquila, Priscilla, and Apollos. Later both Timothy and John became involved in working with the church in Ephesus. How significant is the role of a mentor in the advancing of the gospel?

Video one: Pastors Diego and Hermelin

Relationships can transform the individual lives of believers. Such transformation changes individuals but it also helps mature the body of Christ. Paul's relationship with Aquila and Priscilla did just that.

Video two: Pastors Diego and Hermelin

The relationship between Aquila, Priscilla, and Apollos influenced the transformation of the church. Why did Apollo's visit to Corinth trigger a letter of correction by Paul?

- Discuss the role of mentors in the transformation of the church.
- How important do you feel mentor relationships are to the church today?
- Have you been mentored by anyone? If so, how did that benefit you?
- Have you considered mentoring others? How might that fit into your present lifestyle and calling?

Session Three:

Our Spiritual Inheritance

Now we can jump into the text armed with the background story behind the letter Paul wrote to his beloved Ephesians. First read chapter one of Ephesians, then proceed with viewing the videos for this session.

Video one: *Location, location, location*

Pastor Amanda talks about being “**In Christ**” It is all about being in the right location (In Christ) rather than in the world. It sets us up to inherit blessings.

Video 2: *Discovering one’s identity,*

Pastor Peggy shares that Paul’s prayer for the Church is for spiritual blessings. These blessings reveal their identity in Christ. We will learn about:

- The Spirit of Wisdom and Revelation.
- The opening of our eyes.
- Miracle working power.
- What it means to be seated with him in heavenly places.

What does it mean to be adopted as sons and daughters and how does that set us up to inherit blessings?

Discuss your understanding of each bullet point above and its significance. How do these points relate to discovering one’s identity in Christ and contributing to the body?

Session Four:

A Snapshot View

Most of us have seen “before” and “after” photos, chapter two of Ephesians gives us a similar snapshot view. It is the before and the after of the chosen of God. It portrays us in our fallen state, and it documents the desired transformation that follows when we receive Christ. Read chapter two of Ephesians before proceeding to the video content. Follow with discussion on the points suggested below.

Video 1: Resurrection of the Dead by **Pastor Bruce**

- Discuss the difference between spiritual death and physical death.
- Can we earn spiritual resurrection? If not, how is it obtained?
- What is the significance of circumcision in the Old Testament?
- What is spiritual circumcision?

Video 2: The Two become One by **Pastor Rob**

- Explain how Jesus made peace between the Gentiles and the Jews?
- Discuss what is meant by the “Covenants of Promise” and to whom does the covenant belong?
- Why were the Gentiles referred to as the uncircumcised?
- What is meant by the two becoming one in Christ?
- What does Paul mean that we were created for good works?

Session Five:

Paul Shines the Light of Truth

This chapter begins by discussing the stewardship of Paul to reveal the big mystery, the one that was hidden for centuries. In fact, he says that he is the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of the Gentiles. Read chapter three of Ephesians and view the videos. Follow with discussion on the points suggested below.

Video 1: What is the Big Secret? **By Pastor Peggy**

- Why Paul? What qualified him to receive the revelation?
- What was the “gift of grace” given to Paul?
- What was the eternal purpose of God accomplished “in Christ.”
- Why did Paul refer to his tribulations as their (the Ephesians) glory?

Video 2: Paul’s Prayer of Blessing and conclusion of the first half of the course. **By Pastor Kathy**

- What are the “riches of glory” that Paul is referring to in the later part of this text?
- What does it mean to be filled up with the fullness of God? How does this filling of our vessel relate to the process of maturing spiritually?

The completion of the first three chapters might be likened to laying the foundation of your faith. Stay tuned for part two! It is time to build upon that truth and forge the path to unity.
